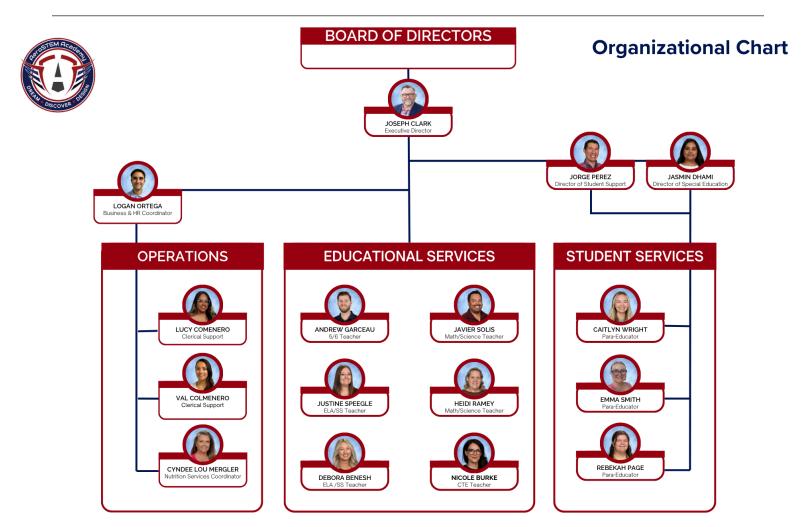

#### **Revenue Insight:**

General Fund YTD revenues totaled \$1,782,978 through May 2025, which is -\$277,744 or -15.6% less than the amount received last year for this period. The YTD difference is driven by an increase in 8010-8099 LCFF Sources of \$352,786, a decrease in 8600-8799 Other Local Revenue of -\$303,593, and a decrease in 8300-8599 Other State Revenue of -\$295,019.

#### **Expense Insights:**

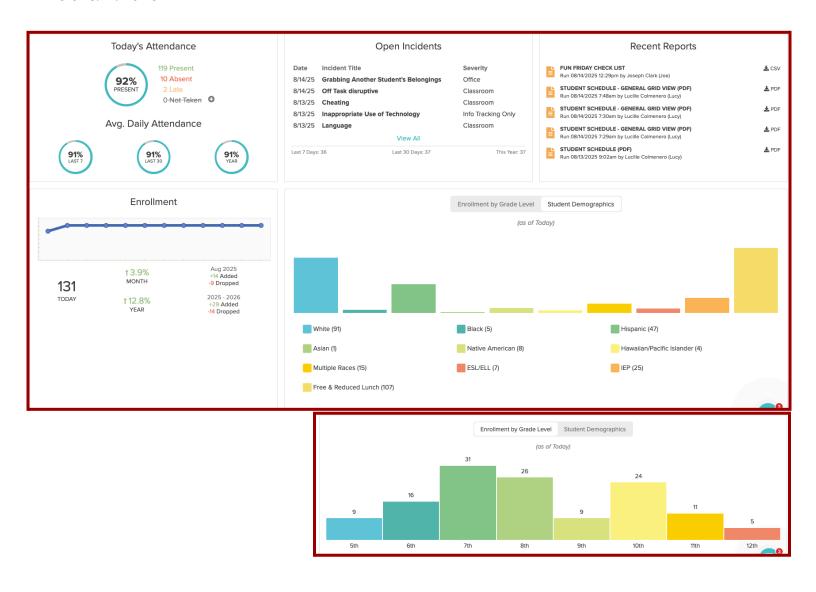
General Fund YTD expenses totaled \$1,962,914 through May 2025, which is -\$73,509 or -3.7% less than the amount spent last year for this period. The YTD difference is driven by a decrease in 6000-6999 Capital Outlay of -\$116,067, a decrease in 5000-5999 Services and Other Operating Expenditures of -\$56,406, and an increase in 2000-2999 Classified Personnel Salaries of \$35,770.
